## Week 1 (22/06, 13/07, 03/08)

#### The British Museum

Directly opposite The English Studio on Museum Street you will find cultural treasures, both ancient and modern, focusing on people, places and stories from our past and present, all at the British Museum.

#### **Thames River Cruise & Greenwich**

Enjoy London from the water including sights such as The London Eye, Houses of Parliament, Big Ben and The Shard. Explore world famous Greenwich, home to the Meridian Line and British naval history.

#### Spitalfields Market, Brick Lane & Graffiti Alley

Brick Lane is a famous street in the East End of London. Experience bustling vintage stores next to intricate street art then see the incredible Graffiti Alley and Spitalfields Market

#### Madame Tussauds

Rub shoulders with hundreds of famous faces including, celebrities, world leaders, historical figures, sports stars, film characters, singers and superheroes!

#### **Corams Fields**

It's Friday! Let your hair down and discover this outdoor gem in the middle of the city. Coram's Fields, close to The English Studio, has a mix of football pitches, basketball courts and table tennis tables and playing fields.

#### Day Trip to Brighton (including Royal Pavilion)

Visit Brighton! Also known as 'Little London' or 'London-by-the-sea'. Enjoy the winding shopping streets of the lanes, Brighton Beach and the famous Palace Pier amusements. Also included is entrance to the Royal Pavilion, now a museum but formerly a Royal Palace. Learn the history of how Brighton was transformed by the Prince Regent and his lavish lifestyle. See the banqueting room, great kitchen, royal bedrooms and gardens.



### Week 2 (29/06, 20/07, 10/08)

# Day Trip to Windsor (including Windsor Castle)

Windsor Castle is the oldest and largest occupied castle in the world. It was founded by William the Conqueror in the 11th century and has since been the home of 40 monarchs. Visit the stunning State Rooms, castle precinct and the treasures of the caste. Spend the rest of the day exploring the pretty and historic town of Windsor.

#### London Transport Museum & Covent Garden

Voted best museum in London for groups, learn the history of London's transport and shop for iconic merchandise from red buses, black taxis, the tube and more. Walk through Covent Garden for sightseeing and shopping in this famous district.

# Cable Car across The Thames and shopping at the O2 Arena

Fly 90 metres above the River Thames, enjoying spectacular views of the capital including, St Paul's, The Gherkin, the City of London and Greenwich. Go shopping at the O2 Outlet Centre with up to 70% off designer brands such as Nike, Adidas and Levi's.

#### **Camden Market & Canal Walk**

Dating back to 1974, London's largest market houses market stalls, food stalls, shops and restaurants. Famous for vintage and alternative clothing it is laid out within cobbled squares and winding alleys. Afterwards, walk along the river canals and escape the busy city in a tranquil environment.

#### **Tower Bridge Exhibition**

Tower Bridge is one of the most iconic and recognisable bridge's in the world. Discover breathtaking views from the spectacular Glass Floors and be amazed by the powerful machinery in the Engine Rooms. Walk along the river and across the Millenium Bridge to see The Tower of London and more.

#### Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park & Shopping

Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park was built for the London 2012 Olympics and it is home to vast parklands, walking trails, shopping and relaxing. Sit in the shadow of the London Stadium, relax in the parks and play games and sports on the grass.

#### Day Trip to Cambridge including Punting

Delight in a day trip to Cambridge, home to the prestigious University of Cambridge which dates back to 1209. Marvel at the architecture, history and beauty of one England's finest cities. Have lunch on the picturesque Backs park and take part in punting on the River Cam, your own special boat tour.







### Week 3 (06/07, 27/07, 17/08)

#### Day Trip to Hampton Court Palace

Discover the home of England's most notorious king, Henry VIII! Admire Henry's Great Hall and Tudor kitchens and discover the spectacular baroque palace built for William III and Mary II. Explore 60 acres of magnificent gardens and the popular Magic Garden adventure playground.

#### **Natural History Museum**

Delve into the history of planet Earth in the Natural History Museum's galleries, which house unique treasures from the museum's collection of more than 80 million objects spanning 4.5 billion years. A striking Victorian building and one of themost famous landmarks in London

#### **Tower of London**

London's famous castle, the Tower of London, is where you can explore nearly 1,000 years of its history as a mighty fortress, royal palace and infamous prison. Marvel at the Crown Jewels, learn gruesome tales in the Bloody Tower and discover much more in this UNESCO World Heritage site.

#### South Bank Walking Tour

Stroll along the South Bank, a beautiful riverside neighbourhood in the heart the city. Walk the promenade past County Hall, the National Theatre and the beautiful Art Deco, Oxo Tower. There are viewpoints to take a picture of Big Ben, the London Eye and St Paul's Cathedral.

#### **Corams Fields**
